


VISION

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HISTORY

ABOUT THE FOUNDER JEAN TH LINDOR

The Association of Exchange and Development of Activities & Partnerships, AEDAP, Inc., originally "Association Et Encadrement Pour Le Developpement De L'Arrière Pays" was founded in February 1982 by Jean Th. Lindor, a native of Cavaillon. Haiti. For Jean, also known as St. Jean, the vision was simply a desire to create a better environment through several development programs for the less fortunate. Jean conducted several trainings in the areas of Education, Health, Arts and Crafts, Sports, and Social Activities. In 1998, Jean provided power of attorney to daughter Marie Flore Lindor Latortue, to continue his dream. AEDAP® is composed of professionals, clinicians, priests, pastors, and youth groups joining to meet with existing organizations to launch and support grassroots projects.

2006 TO PRESENT

The Association of Exchange and Development of Activities and Partnerships, AEDAP has been unique is bringing community-based organizations together once a year particularly in September for a leadership retreat and to build a community calendar profiling each other's missions, discussing their challenges and share collective solutions for stronger communities.

This has been AEDAP's highlights for the past 17 years. Focusing on that global vision, AEDAP has experienced some fallback.

In October 2023, AEDAP was finally awarded to be part of the Childrens Trust Capacity Building Cohort.

Budget

With a budget of \$75.000, AEDAP had all the right players in place but all investing voluntarily to the vision and programming with an estimated of \$25,734.07 in In-Kind time.

AEDAP PARENTS VOICES – DESCRIPTION

<u>AEDAP PARENTS VOICES</u> aligns with the metrix of Education. Started in 2019, this safety platform has been created to welcome parents of the underserved demographics of South Dade. Often left behind, South Dade needed to be put on the map and AEDAP has been advocating for the targeted populations where there has not been funding or very limited funds to answer to their education's needs particularly people formation and development support.

<u>AEDAP PARENTS VOICES</u> is an evidence-based parenting approach, unique that is 90 minutes session, designed originally to be virtual as it was created during the COVID 19 pandemic. However, AEDAP PARENTS VOICES evolved to be an In-Person psycho-social and educational support sessions for Haitian parents primarily but also welcome referred parents from community partners. AEDAP PARENTS VOICES is culturally diverse with sessions with parents from different ethnic groups and facilitators who are also culturally prepared and with the language skills to serve African- American, Hispanic and Haitian speaking participants.

<u>Outputs</u>

In 2023, program delivered 10 programs

- 8 in-person sessions
- 2 outreach initiatives
- 2 hybrid classes.



Challenges:

- Lack of funding to execute and meet parents needs.
- Increase of new referrals demands with the arrival of new parents' immigrants.
- Limited capacity to meet demands.

<u>Outputs</u>

- Identify new partners.
- Organize two outreach events.
- Modify marketing plan.
- Develop program curriculum with community feedback.
- Start collecting data.
- Write SMART plan for 2024 including seeking funding to build and strengthen the program's sustainability.



AEDAP PROFESSIONAL YOUNG LEADERS



Established in 2006, AEDAP professional young leaders is open to boys and girls aged 5- 18 years.

The program encompasses three specific developmental stages.

Stage 1- Initial and beginning.

Stage 2 – Intermediate

Stage 3- Leadership

Stage 1- Initial and beginning.

From 5- 10 years - The Initial and/or beginner stage focuses in sessions for boy and girls to know about themselves. The Identity's program for AEDAP youth called for them to be exposed to the concept of professionalism at early age. Boys and Girls are introduced to the philosophy of Gade Tet Ouselfcare where they speak, learn to be independent, descriptive of their environment and start building bonds while being respectful of their peers.



In 2023, AEDAP conducted sessions with its partnered schools, churches. Our main partner for this program has been Art A L. AEDAP met with children and facilitators shared these topics:

- Who Am I?
- Beyond my last name.
- Being independent at early age.
- Understanding responsibilities.



• Play some role at home and in this program.

Stage 2- Intermediate

From 10 -15 years – Big Brother – Big Sister concept. – These AEDAP professionals know to match with a younger program's member. They become a peer to a younger brother and sister. At this stage of the program, we mix the group-ages as well, allowing them to start appreciating their differences, enhancing their listening skills, and being part of team projects. At this stage, the introduction to volunteerism is key for AEDAP



In 2023, AEDAP, for the intermediate group conducted two team projects



Stage 3- Leadership

From 15- 18 years – Leaders – At this stage, AEDAP participants understand the importance of leadership. They participate with session that equip them with leadership skills that make them understand the importance of readiness for their respective community, engagement, participation, practice, documentation and rewards.

They have to commit to earn their community service hours for their respective schools to enter colleges.

At this stage, leaders lead session, complete projects, request and participate in field trips. Come and report their lessons learned, start also becoming AEDAP's ambassadors to recruit for other promotions.



In 2023, AEDAP, for the leadership group counted two high school graduates



Programs Growth & Success Challenges

Education continues to be the present metrics in this program. In 2023, the program started with 25 families enrolled and about 30 boys and girls enrolled. As the program is yearlong, statically, AEDAP was able to retain less than its 50% of the program total. The variables for the decrease in retention is justified by:

- Lack of funding.
- Unexpected life changes for some families.
- Parents unemployment or illness.
- Participants moving out of the area.
- Participants graduated from High school and going to college and not completing their ambassador's tasks.





Positive outcomes

- 10 active alumni.
- Becoming now active volunteers.
- Slow outreach and marketing initiative.
- Meeting new organizations during same work.
- Listening and learning from them.
- Sharing resources Writing grants – Looking for all sources of funding and sponsorships.

AEDAP SENIORS HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Mental health stability, cognitive benefits, the physical maintenance, and self-esteem are the needs that AEDAP's seniors' health and wellness is addressing.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, AEDAP conducted a series of food drives with FARM SHARE, specifically at South Miami Heights Haitian Baptist Church in Cutler Bay, District 9.

The financial conditions of our seniors, living off an EBT card with a maximum of \$150.00 a month and a low income from Social Security checks, pose significant challenges.

AEDAP's seniors' health and wellness program is needed to bridge the gap between traditional and required doctor's visits and the daycare facilities, where they spend 6 to 8 hours, with most of the daycare hours currently being reduced.

The program offers an exceptional art component that addresses these needs.

Outcomes and Outputs

In 2023, AEDAP in collaboration with St Anne Garden, its institution partners of over ten years served about 80 seniors, the grandparents who benefited from service, including the yearly Thanksgiving celebration. Seniors were able to maintain their cognitive abilities, engage in social activities and more.

<u>Challenge</u>

Sessions were put on hold for two years due the pandemic.

COMMUNITY CALENDAR

The community calendar is AEDAP's authentic tool is placed for 17 years. This tool is used to profile, promote, and uplift partnered CBOs mission. AEDAP community calendar is more than a calendar of events.

It brings partnered organizations together once a year in September for the leadership retreat. A platform that has allowed, faithbased, businesses, vocational entrepreneurs, taxi drivers, elected officials, providers, all stakeholders, primarily Haitians and their allies to report of their yearly accomplishments, share their challenges and celebrate their success collectively.





The Community Calendar the path to build strong partnership

In 2023, AEDAP community calendar and leadership retreat initiated the movement of Partnership Legacy where it was decided to conduct monthly partners' meeting virtually to continue building for and on each other for stronger communities.

AEDAP WOMEN RURAL PROJECT

Created in the 5th rural region of Cavaillon, Haiti, AEDAP Women Project is women led. The program is comprised of girls as young as 15 years old and women in the golden age of 90. AEDAP women rural project is designed to equip women with the agricultural skills enabling them to stay in their area, develop it to reduce poverty and build on their economical sustainability.

In 2023, one individual had decided to adopt this program and invested \$500.00. AEDAP is welcoming more donors like that.

The program has been severely impacted by the natural disaster caused by the Grand-South earthquake in 2021, and the serious political unrest. For the purpose of this report, AEDAP is seeking funding to keep this program running. This project is our major area of needs.



AEDAP ADOP A FAMILY

In 2023, AEDAP received 30 families referrals for this program. Program started in 2021 to assist new parents/immigrants' families who arrived from the Mexican borders and/or families who suffered a loss due to natural disaster, fire and find themselves homeless.

For the past 3 years, AEDAP has been leading the mental transition for these families to find 2 nights of refuge until they reconnect from loved ones. AEDAP also established partnership with 5 short-term residential/ motel/ hotel industry to help execute this program.



A DAY WITH A CHEF

One partner has been identified for this program, However, a decision was made to officially launched it in February 2024.



When books were removed from schools, AEDAP added a day with the chef in February to celebrate Black History's month bringing children, their parents and the community-at-large to celebrate History and Black connections with all cultures.

CAPACITY BUILDING

As part of its mission to build leaders and providing technical support to partnered organizations, AEDAP has been offering professional development seminars in-person and/or hybrid on topic related such as: self-care for providers, capacity building, financial accountability and more. Together For Children (TFC) has been any immediate partner in this initiative.
